

Duncan Allison

Air Commodore Duncan Allison died on August 3rd 2013. Duncan served as a Tiger from November 1954 - November 1956 on Meteors and again from September 1957 to January 1958 on Hunters. His RAF career in total spanned over 37 years. With 74 he was one of the top scorers in air to air gunnery exercises and was Squadron PAI from September 1955. The Tigers were the official Fighter Command Meteor Formation Aerobatic Team of 1956 and Duncan flew as No 4 alongside the CO Keith Haselwood No 1, Brian Walpole (later replaced by Dick Lewis) No 2 and Chuck Sewell No 3. Another memorable occasion for Duncan as a Tiger was the setting with Keith Haselwood of a speed record between Aldergrove and St Faith in a pair of Hunter F.4s, completing the flight at an average speed of 724 mph.
